

# EIGHTY GRADUATED AT AGNES SCOTT'S CLOSING EXERCISES

Eighty seniors of Agnes Scott college received diplomas at the graduating exercises of the commencement program at the institution, held Tuesday morning at the college chapel. Dr. J. R. McCain, president, presented the diplomas with appropriate remarks.

Dr. Edwin Mins, head of the department of English at Vanderbilt university, delivered the graduating address.

J. K. Orr, president of the board of trustees, and Mrs. D. B. Donaldson, president of the Agnes Alumnae association, spoke briefly.

Miss Elizabeth Cheatham, of Atlanta, and Miss Margery Speaker, of Huntsville, Ala., were graduated with high honor; Miss Sara Fullbright, of East Lake, and Miss Martha Cobb, of Decatur, with honor.

Miss Juanita Greer, of Atlanta, received the prize for highest grades made by a member of the senior class. Miss Miriam Preston, of Korea, received honorable mention; Miss Elizabeth Grier, of China, received the piano prize; Miss Virginia Miller, of Huntington, W. Va., the voice prize; Miss Mary Freeman, of College Park, the spoken English prize, and Miss Mary Ella Hammond, of Griffin, the mathematics prize.

Miss Grier received also a \$50 prize offered for the best general average in the freshman class. Seniors winning credit for excellent work are: Miss Cheatham, Miss Agatha Deaver, of Brevard, N. Announcement was made that the new college building to be erected immediately will be named for George Bucher Scott, son of the founder of the college and himself for thirty years chairman of the committee on building and grounds.

Five new scholarships were announced: The first by ninety employers of the Atlantic Ice and Coal company; the second, by the family of the late Mr. George F. Armstrong, of Savannah; the third by the family of the late Mr. George J. Mills, of Savannah; the fourth, by alumnae and friends of the college in memory of Miss Mary D. Sheppard, a former teacher of the institution; the fifth, by alumnae and friends of the college in memory of Miss Martha Merrill, a student of the institution at the time of her death in 1905.

A \$700 endowment fund was presented to the college by the graduating class in memory of Miss Martha Bowen, a former classmate, who died several years ago.
