Opening of Atlanta's municipal airplane landing field on Virginia avenue, near Hapeville, has been tentasively set for July 3, it was anyounced Saturday by Mayor Sime, whe said, however, that a definite date could not be fixed until the county could determine when alignating work will be finished.

The new field will be triangular in length. Air officials have declared that when completed, it will be one of the finest in the country.

The city obtained the field from Ass G. Candler, Inc., for a period of live years, at an annual rental equal to the taxes assessed against the property. The city-alse holds an option to purchase the tract of land any time within the term of the lease for \$100,000.


