

Emory Student Heads Woodrow Wilson Post Of Disabled Veterans

Finch, veteran of the World war, and vice president of the law student body of Emory university, where he was sent by the veterans' bureau for training as a lawyer, Tuesday night was elected commander of Woodrow Wilson chapter, No. 1, Disabled American Veterans of the World war, it is announced.
