Esse County State of Maryland
In Agulla Green considering the Impermanence of this
Mortal Life & Being of Sound mind & Memory
Blessed be Almighty God for the same

I do make & publish this ~~same~~ my Last will
in the following manner & form (To wit),

first my will is that all my just debts &
funeral Expensy be paid

2ndly I Give & Bequeath to my Beloved wife
Sally all my Real & personal Estate during her
Natural Life or Widowhood with mention
House & improvement The same after death
to be divided Equally Between my three Children
Viz^t John Nancy & Catty &

Thirdly I Give unto my Beloved Son William
Elebere Negroes which he has Received of his
mother's Estate I will that he have one hundred
dollars more of my Estate

fourthly I Give unto my Beloved Son John
Twenty Nine hundred & fifty dollars
which he has Rec^d I will that he Shall have
one Negro Girl Pigea which I don't charge
for

fifthly I Give unto my Beloved daughter
Nancy Thirty Six hundred & forty Nine dollars
which She has already Rec^d & I Give unto my daughter
Catty \$249 which She has
already Rec^d

after the death of my wife my will is that
my Son John Shall have the lower End of
the Land & that Catty Shall have the upper End
of the Land where I now live including the
dwelling house & the improvements that each one
makes is not to be Valued when divided
I do hereby constitute & appoint my
Beloved Son John & Give

I my Son-in-law Elias Draughon Both being
of the County & State of North Carolina
my Sole Executors of this my Last will &
Testament hereby Ratifying all other wills
by me made in witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & seal this 24th
day of October in the year of our Lord
one Thousand Eight hundred & Thirty Eight
