

North Carolina Ashe County June 16th 1884

I B. W. Weaver of the County of Ashe and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and every way qualified to transact my own business as in the name of God Amen Will and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Cathine and her children a tract of land bounded as follows

Beginning on a maple running with George Binkette line to Frederich Prades line then with his line to a sun wood and agreed course then following an agreed line and easterly course to a chestnut oak near Bottles branch then east to a chestnut then to the beginning except the school house site and all mineral with mining and shipping privileges. Also I will that my son W. B. Weaver and his children have the land that he now lives upon and bounded as follows adjoining the lands of Hugh Hays George Binkette and others running to a maple then north to a chestnut then West 16 poles to a chestnut then Northwardly course of the ridge to a bunch of chestnuts then to an apple tree then with the ridge fence to Hugh Hays line the mineral excepted with mining and shipping privileges

I will that my son B. L. Weaver and his children have the land contained in the following bounds Beginning on a maple running east to a oak then West to an apple tree then North 64 poles to a chestnut Wilsons course then with said Wilsons line west to a water oak in J. H. Prades line then with said Prades line to a stake Prades course near his mine house then north to the head of the branch then with the branch to the beginning Except the mineral with mining and shipping privileges

I will that my two daughters have the old home stead where I now live and bounded as follows adjoining the lands of Cathine Binkette W. B. Weaver B. L. Weaver George Ham and others except the mineral with mining and shipping privileges. I will that my son Noah Weaver and my daughter Matilda Daily each have two hundred acres

Ordain publish and declare this to be my last
will and testament that is to say First after
all my lawful debts are paid and discharged
the residue of my estate real and personal I
give and bequeath and devise of as follows
to wit

To my beloved wife Caroline I give and bequeath
one cow and all my household and kitchen
furniture and all of my farming tools also
shall have the privilege to cultivate as much
of the land as she may see cause for her
Maintenance whereon I now live as long
as she remains my widow. I give and bequeath
unto my two sons to wit William S. and Daniel
G. Blewens all the land and all the adjoining
tracts whereon I now live to be equally divided
between them. I also give and bequeath to my
son Manly Blewens all the lands whereon he
now lives in the County of Ashe on the waters
of Huttons Creek adjoining the lands of Winstons
Blewens & others to my daughter Franky Pennington
I give and bequeath the strip of land lying
between her line and David Blewens line. The
three above named sons to wit Manly Blewens
William S. Blewens & Daniel G. Blewens are to
equally pay four hundred dollars which said
sum is to be equally divided and paid to
Nily Blewens Nily Coates Matthew Hurdler Chas
Brown Gendema Thwe and Catharine Stuart
and Catharine Perkins and the heirs of Jamoy

Bye they the said heirs of Jamoy are to share
equally in the fifty dollars their another part only
to be paid by my three sons to wit Manly William
S. & Daniel G. at the expiration of two years
after my death ~~should~~ they be of age, if they
should not be age they are to have two years

And all my personal property remaining at
my death outside of the above bequest is to
be equally divided or sold and the proceeds
