

Barnabas Evans' Will

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November 1<sup>st</sup> 1851.

In the name of God Amen

I Barnabas Evans being sick & weak of body but of sound and disposing mind memory & understanding considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof to the end that I may be the better prepared to leave this world when it shall please my God to call me hence have now determined to direct what disposition shall be made of my property after my decease, and after maturely considering these circumstances and conditions of all those among whom as my heirs at Law or the objects of my gratitude or affection in my judgment my Estate should be distributed I do make publish & declare this to be my last Will & Testament hereby revoking and making null & void all former last wills & Testaments & writings in the nature of last wills & Testaments by me heretofore ~~made~~ made I give & bequeath to Lucy Hill my cloths & prop. grain enough to do her till the date of 1853 & also half the meat of five hogs that is killed this year, & also all of my feed

My will is that my executors shall sell the balance of my property household & kitchen furniture & it equally divided amongst my heirs David Evans' heirs Alexander Perky William Evans and Nancy Whitaker's heirs Francis Spurline Abram Evans. the above named Whitakers heirs is a note of eight dollars & interest is to be taken out of their part & an equal division amongst above named, I now appoint Martin F. Hill my executor to my last will & testament in testimony whereof,
