Thurs. during her lifetime, I then desire her and
her increase to belong to my heirs. I also desire
my wife to have choice of two of my cows also
my clay banks now if she desires her if not
let her be sold with the rest of my property I
desire that my land be sold at public sale by
advertisement and all of the rest of my property
that I have not disposed of otherwise on a twelve
months credit and the proceeds thereof to be
put to interest. and the proceeds thereof to
belong to my heirs except what is necessary
for the use and benefit of my wife, I also
Constitute & appoint my beloved friend C. H.
Daughter & Manning S. Daughters the Executors of
this my last will and testament, Given under
my hand & seal this 20th day of Oct 1856
