make and ordain this my last will and testament
in manner and form following to wit
that is to say

I give my soul to God who gave it and my
body to the earth from whence it came with
a decent Christian burial. I will that all my
just debts be paid by Escutier herein after named
I will that my beloved wife have a home where
I now live as long as she lives and be completely
provided for by my Escutier during her life
I have advanced to my son John J. Howell and
Amos Howell their full share of my estate or a
trust it and give them or their heirs ten dollars
each to be paid by my Escutier
I give to David Howell son of Eli Van and
Malinda Van One hundred and fifty dollars
to be paid by my Escutier. Over.

I give to my son James Howell One hundred and twenty dollars to make him equal with William Howell who has had the sum of \$1420.00

I give to my daughter Rhody Hardin four hundred and twenty dollars to make her equal with William and James I give to Martha Bentey eight hundred and seventy dollars to make her equal with the rest

I give to Matilda Cull nine hundred and twenty dollars \$920.00 to make her equal with the rest

I will that my Executor sell all my property of every description remaining at the death of me and my wife and divide the proceeds after paying the above legacies equally among James Howell William Howell Martha Bentey Rhody Hardin and Matilda Cull

I hereby affix my friend William B. Cull
Executor of this my last will and testament
