Will of Geo H Hamilton
In the name of God amen
I Geo H Hamilton of Ashe County State
of North Carolina do make and ordain
this my last will and testament in manner
and form following

1st I will and ordain that all my unpaid
debts be paid by my executors.

2 - It is my will and desire that my
wife Elvira shall keep possession of the
home place known by the old Ray place
containing 140 acres as long as she lives
or her Macowood and then to my son
Geo Hagg Hamilton Jr as in hereinbefore
mentioned also I want my executors to
leave as much stock and household man
kitchen furniture and grain as they may
think she needs so she will have plenty
and at her death or marriage to be dis
posed off that is the personal property not
the lands and the proceeds to be equally
divided among my four children.

1 I will to my son William H Hamilton
the mill tract of land whenever he may
live containing two hundred and
thirty acres (230) known as the Butter Lands
except the portion herein after mentioned
named which I will to my son Rufus
involving the mill race fields and upper
meadow and woodland the balance of
the tract to be my son Williams and
also an undivided half of the tract of
land known as the Myott tract containing
two hundred and fourteen acres
deeded to me by Aron Myott. Also an
undivided half of two tracts of one hundred
acres each improved land on the East
side of the Padiy Mountain. the other
half to my son Geo H.

The lands I give to my son William H S
Value at their thousand dollars to account
for at a final settlement as I desire all
shall be used and spent in the best

4th I give to my daughter Mary Jane Cushing and her heirs forever all my lands on the waters of the Salmon containing about one hundred acres in four different tracts known as the Cleveland Creek tract, Easton tract bought of Justice Johnson and also the land I entered adjoining. I value the land I give to my daughter Mary Jane Cushing at fifteen hundred dollars.

5th

I will to my son Rufus A Hamilton my will the lines to commence at the fork of the Creek running south along the road to the fork of the ditch called the dam ditch that runs west of the present spring and turn up said ditch opposite a white oak there by said white oak Hardins corner to corner of mine and Hardins side of Turnpike then around the road field and upper meadow to Hardins Goodman line then around with his line to stake so as to include twenty acres woodland adjoining Harrison Goodmans and Jacob Goodmans then to the beginning at the fork of the creek so as to include the house that Ben Garrison lives in the open field upper meadow and the twenty acres of woodland laying south of the road that runs by Garrison Goodmans. I value the lands and will I give to my son Rufus A at fifteen hundred dollars. I also give to my son Rufus two tracts of land on the Rock Mountain one ~~one thousand~~ as the first place deeded to me by Jerry Ray containing one hundred and eight acres. the other one hundred and granted to me by the State laying west and of first mentioned and adjoining.

6th I give to my son Geo H Hamilton of the house tract called the Ray tract at the death of my wife also my tract adjoining called

the Roland tract containing seventy seven acres (77) also one half undivided of my Myatt tract of land containing ten hundred and forty acres. Also one half of the tract on Paddy Mountain containing one hundred and acres each the other half of said lands I give to my son Jim as stated above

It is my desire that my son Geo H will remain with his mother so long as she lives. I value the lands I give to my son Geo H at Three Thousand dollars,

7th

Those of my children that has not received as much as others at my death in lands and advancements as per my will ^{my} books will be paid in property or money. if not my executors will sell of my personal property or lands not Will'd and make them my four children or in case they are dead their heirs equal allacing a competency to my wife.

8th

I appoint my son William and natural friends Riley & Thomas my executors of this my last will and testament

I revoke all former wills made by me by testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this the 9th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy one (1871)
