

Will of Gideon Weaver

I Gideon Weaver of the county of Ashe and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and disposing memory do make and declare this my last will & testament in manuscript form following That is to say

I will that at my death my body be buried in a manner suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends and that all my just debts be paid out of the first moneys coming into the hands of Executors hereafter named. I give and bequeath all my real estate to my son Mitchell Weaver and my Grandson James C. Kolana to equally divide between the two shares & shares alike.

I give and bequeath my personal property to Mitchell Weaver and the children of my daughter Nancy Catherine Kolana and Jane Miller Shain or Shares alike. In the event that my son Mitchell Weaver should die without lawful heirs then and in that case my will is that all my property both real and personal bequeathed to the said Mitchell go to my Grandson David C. Kolana. I desire that my Executor hereafter named shall after my death appoint two disinterested free holders in this county to act as commissioners to divide the above named property between my legates as a lot named and in case of disagreement between said commissioners as to the valuation of said property then and in that case the above named legates shall have the right to choose a third person to act with the other two Commissioners and the said division of said commissioners shall be final and to which each of my heirs shall submit without appeal.

I here by appoint my trusty friend Joseph O. Wiley my Executor to execute to all my intent and purposes this my last will and hereby revoking all other wills. Therefore by my words I in testimony whereof I set my hand and seal this the 15<sup>th</sup> day of April A. D. 1880. signed as and sealed in the presence of
