And lastly I do nominate and appoint Cicer Lour to be the Executor of this my last will and Testament my witness whereof I the said Hamilton B. Blackburn have to this my last Will and Testament consisting of sheet of paper subscribed by me and affix my seal the fourteenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety one signed sealed published and declared by the said Hamilton B. Blackburn in me for his last Will and Testament in the presence of me who at his request and in his presence and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses thereto.
