I give and bequeath to my said wife Mary A Childers all the Real Estate now belonging to me on the South side of the river including in it lands in the river and the said Mary A Childers is hereby empowered to cultivate or have cultivated the said lands and have the proceeds of the said lands for her exclusive use as she may see proper during her natural life but none of said lands to be sold during her natural life.

Item fourth

After the proceeds of the said lands have been paid her the said Mary A Childers during her natural life and she needs at no more than said lands shall fall to my heirs they may divide the lands among themselves or sell the lands as they may see cause and equally divide the proceeds.

Item fifth
