her. My will is that my Executors shall pay

penses and divide the net proceeds among all of
my heirs equally as it comes into said Execut-
ors hands - My will is that my wife Easie Burgess
may have what stock on the farm that she
may need - My will is that my Executors shall
collect all my debts and sell all my outside
property and apply the proceeds for the maintenance of
my wife Easie and daughter Laura Bell Burgess
as they may need it judiciously. My will is that
if Joseph Spears shall remain with my wife until
he is 21 Twenty one years old and leaves
himself and minds her that my Executors shall
buy him a common two year old horse Bridle
and Saddle and a suit of Clothes. I hereby appoint
my son D. H. Burgess and my son in Law T. L. Lyon
my true friends Executors to carry out the true
