- Fourth I will and bequeath unto my daughter Birdie
Long all the remainder of any of my money arising
from my personal checks for the year 1900, or any money
belonging to me at my death and my will and
desire is that my Executor shall deposit with
J. L. Pasley all the money if any that is left to
my daughter Birdie Long and let her draw bill
to be paid her alone as she needs it in such things
as she needs to be paid in shoes and clothing for
herself by the order of Executor and in
other way.
