provided that the said Elizabeth Taylor
continues to live with me and wait on
me until death

2d I Give and Bequeath to my friend James
Monroe all the rest of my lands to him
and his heirs forever

4th It is my desire wish that my
Executor Sell all my property not
heretofore disposed of and out of the
proceeds thereof to pay all my just
Debit and if there should remain any
thing after my debts be paid as
said then

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When I desire it to be devolved among the
heirs of Mathias Pae. my said husband
I do hereby appoint James P. Haugh
Executor of this my last will and
Testiment and desire that he should
collect and dispose of all my property
as here to fore expressed except as a bill
due me from old Spack for collars
which I do not want collected from him
at all after my Death in Testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
