 and uncertain life, do therefore, declare
 & publish & declare this to be my last will and
 testament that is to say, first, after all
 my just debts & c. I have paid, for my son
 Isaac Goodman to E. Blackburn & H. Phillips, to paid
 & discharged, a sum of one whole Real & Personal
 & give and bequeath & dispose of as follows To wit
 To my son Jacob A Goodman, all my Personal
 property, that I own & use, except after all is
 made equal up to four hundred dollars with my son
 John. That the over has had all do. My share
 that I own, lying on, all or half of the
 Quinn tract being on the other side of the
 Whittle Mountain together with all he makes
 clear or may have at the death of his father
 & mother if he faithfully take care of them
 until their death. Then the said Jacob A
 Goodman to come in full possession of all, that
 may be left after decent burial all or one tract
 of land, containing one hundred acres, lying on
 the waters of North Branch Union County, Pa.
 and one hundred & fifty acres, lying on the
 Whittle Mountain, more or less, together with
 Jacob Goodman, Sen. & D. Morris.
 I like wise, I make, constitute & appoint my said
 son Jacob A Goodman, to be executor of this my last
 will and testament here by bearing all former
 wills by me made & since voided & I have
 here unto, subscribed my name, and affixed
 my seal, the 28th day of May in the year of our
 Lord One Thousand eight Hundred and one
