I Jeremiah Patric of Wake County and
State of North Carolina being of sound mind and
memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly
circumstances do make ~~and ordain~~ this my last
will and Testament in manner and form following
that is to say.

I give and devise to my youngest daughter Mariah
Patric two hundred acres of land said land to
be all in one body but I give my daughter Mariah
the right to have the lines run and establish
whatever she may desire to do to include my
manor house and all other improvements in
the two hundred acres above named.

I give and bequeath to my daughters Polly Shute
and Lizzy Patric the balance of the land now owned
by me twenty acres more or less to be equally
divided between the two I give and devise
to my son George Patric One set of Carpenter
tools I give and devise to each one of the
children of my daughter Bettie Sycall deserved
one dollar each to be paid to them by my
daughter Mariah Patric within two years from
my death or as soon thereafter as they may
become of age I give and devise to the children
James Patric one dollar to be paid to be paid
by my daughter Mariah Patric within two years
from my death I give and devise to my beloved
wife Eva Patric all of my money and personal
property what ever not otherwise disposed of in
my will to have and to hold the same for her own
use during her natural life and at her
death whatever she may have left shall go to
my daughter Mariah Patric and her heirs and
lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my
trusty daughter Mariah Patric my lawful Executor
to all intents and purposes to execute this my
last will and Testament according to the true
intent and meaning of the same I hereby revoke
and declare utterly void all other wills and
Testaments by me hitherto made In witness

whereof I the said Jeremiah Patric do hereunto
set my hand by hand and seal this the eleventh
day of June A.D. 1887.
