I John F. Greer of the above County and State. Do make and declare this to be my last Will and Testament

First of all is I will and bequeath my Soul unto God who gave it and my body to a decent Christian burial the maker of which I leave to my surviving friends Now as to my property both real and personal after my just debts is paid my will then is that each one of my heirs be made equal after deducting what each one has already received So my Son Cattel A Green I have already given in Land and other property to the amount of Two thousand and ninety five dollars and eighty one cents and to my Son John Ireland Greer in Land to the amount of Two thousand and Two hundred dollars and to my Son Edwin D. Greer I have given in Land and other property to the amount of Three thousand one hundred and seventy three Dollars and Six cents I also gave my Son Edwin D. Greer as receipt to the amount of about Six hundred Dollars bearing date of about November on December 1883 This said receipt did not nor was not intended to cover the amount that he is above charged with and my Will is that whatever remainder of property that is going to my Son Edwin D. Greer or to his heirs after deducting the above amount I want equally divided between my three Grand Daughters viz. Martha Almada Shipp and Rosa Adelia Woodie and Sarah Kenneria Greer and if my Grand Daughter Minnie L. Greer is not provided for by her Grand father Bryan she is to have and equal share of what is going to my Son Edwin D. Greer So my Son Paul Jones Greer I have given in Land and other property to the amount of Two thousand and ninety Eight Dollars and twenty eight cents also one horse valued at one hundred Dollars So my Son William Calvin Greer

I have given in Land to the amount of Two thousand Two hundred and fifty Dollars and I hereby appoint my three Sons viz. Cattel A Green, Paul Jones Greer, and William Calvin Greer to be my executors to this my last Will to see that the provisions of said Will is carried out And my will further is that my beloved wife Martha Greer have a child's part of my estate in witness whereof I have this day set my hand and affixed my seal this the 12th day of December A.D. 1884

I Daniel Miller of Ashe County and State of North Carolina, farmer, being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and declare this to be my will and Testament. And as to my worldly estate and all the property real, personal, or mixed, of which, I shall die seized and possessed or to which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease I devise, bequeath, and dispose thereof in the manner following to wit: My Will is that all my just debts and funeral expenses shall by my Executors herein after named be paid out of my Estate as soon after decease as shall by them be found convenient. I give devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Ellen Miller, my house and household furniture and all things belonging to the same and also provided she needs it \$500 or fifty dollars in money to be paid to her by my Executors herein after named within six months after my decease I also give to her the use, improvement and income of my dwelling house and also a claim of seven in the house track as heretofore specified the said land and house to be had during the term of her natural life then said land and house to belong to my son Judge Buxton Miller as specified in indent made to him heretofore also after her death my will is that my household furniture shall be equally divided between my two sons Judge B. and Samuel J. Miller.

I give and bequeath to my son Samuel J. Miller one horse and one Cow the same to be his from this date and to hold and possess the same as his own I give devise and bequeath to my son Judge B. Miller one Mare one Colt and one Cow the same to be his from this date to use and to hold as his own I give devise and bequeath to my two sons Judge B. Miller and Samuel J. Miller all my grain and one shot mitter.
