In the name of God Amen, of Ashe County being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God do this 22nd day of September A.D. 1826 make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner following, That is to say

First. I give and bequeath unto my eldest daughter Peggy Five Shillings after my decease This making her equal with the rest. I give and bequeath unto my eldest son Richard One Hundred Dollars after my decease This making him equal with the rest. I give and bequeath unto my youngest son David One Hundred Dollars after my decease This making him equal with the rest. I give and bequeath unto my second daughter Susanah One Hundred Dollars after my decease This making her equal with the rest. I give and bequeath unto my youngest daughter Mary One Hundred Dollars after my decease This making her equal with the rest, leaving the balance to my beloved wife Hannah as long as she remains my widow, at her decease if there is any thing left to be divided equal with the heirs, and I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend Richard Green Executor, of this my last will and Testament
