- 3rd I give and bequeath to my beloved wife one
bay mare & colt known as the Wily Mare mare
and by head of sheep and all the hogs that
are called mine this property to belong to her
and her children
- 4th I give to my wife Wily Vany the bed and
chid and furniture one cupboard that sits in
the sitting room and cook stove and utensils
Three lead bottom chairs one large looking glass
the bed named in this item is the bed I lay on
this property named in the 4th item is to belong to
my wife as long as she lives or remains my widow
then it falls back to my children
- 5th I will to my children all the remainder of
my estate to be divided equal among them
with what they have already had. And I apoint
my two sons my executors to wit James H. Vany &
Wily S. Vany of them my will & testament given under
my hand and seal. August the 8th 1885

I give and bequeath to them the land I have now with all my farming tools household and kitchen furniture I also give them at my death all the money and notes that is on hand at my death after paying my debts for the support of the said Victory and Jane and for schooling and support of Nicholas Biddle Jacks son of Victory the land to be left by the said Victory and Jane Jacks for their benefit and at their death the land to be the property of the said Nicholas Biddle Jacks It is my will that my two daughters Victory and Jane is to control all my land and property their lifetime and at their death the aforesaid land I have now is to be the property of my grandson Nicholas Biddle Jacks.

4d I appoint my two daughters Victory and Jane Jacks my lawful executors to this my last will and testament witness July 16th 1878
