life do therefore make and declare  
this to be my last will and testament  
that is to say

1st After all my just debts, is paid and

and personal I give and bequeath as follows  
To wit, To my beloved wife all the lands  
and appertaining situate thereon situated by  
me together with all the stock farming  
tools house held and kitchen furniture  
during her natural life after her  
death to be equally divided among my  
children I mean and borne alike and  
it is my desire and it is my desire that my  
Mother shall have a home and support from  
her self as long as she wishes to remain on  
my lands likewise I make constitute  
and appoint Leonard Herrell to be  
executor to execute of this my last  
will and testament hereby revoking all  
former wills made by me in witness  
whereof I have hereunto Subscribed my  
name and affixed my seal this year the  
17<sup>th</sup> 1871.
