John Whittington's Will

In the name of God Amen. I John Whittington
being weak in body considering the uncertainty
of this mortal life, and being of sound and
perfect mind and memory. Blessed be Alm
right God for the same, do make and publish
this my Last Will & Testament in manner
& form following (to wryt).

First I will that all my just debts be paid
Secondly I Bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah
Whittington an Equal and distributive
share with all my Children, of all my
Personal Estate, and that Each Child
be entitled to his or her share as they
severally come of age.

Thirdly I will that my beloved Wife
have such portion as the Law directs
of my Real Estate, allowing but all &
singular the proffets arising therefrom
untill the youngest Child comes of age
for the purpose of raising them in de
cency, and after the youngest Child
comes of age then for the Lands to be equ
ally divided amongst the whole of them
And for effecting the purposes above
mentioned, I do hereby appoint my two
brother and loving friend & Brother Leonard
Whittington and William Johnson. my Exe
cutors to this my last Will and testament here
by revoking all former Wills by me made
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand & seal. 15th August 1802,

Benjamin Ward Will

In the name of God Amen. I Benjamin Ward of the County of Ashe and State of North Carolina, Being infirm in body but at the same time in my senses and of sound mind and memory blessed be God I do hereby ordain and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following (lawn)

First

I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Selah Ward sixty nine dollars of my money and all my starting & gathering bread grain, unto her own proper use and behoof forever, then I give unto my said wife Selah all my Negros during her natural lifetime and also all my household furniture & clothing & bedding and every other article & complement of her board dry and farming utensils. after which then it is my desire that all my Negros above mentioned, named, Jack Esquire Esther Emilia & Nancy go to and I do here by give and bequeath said Negros unto my son Accademus Ward and his heirs for ever all and singular the aforesaid Negros provided that the said Accademus Ward shall pay to my son Kelly Ward Mrs Ward & my two daughters Selah Ward & Elizabeth Will four hundred Dollars Dack. furthermore it is my desire and I do hereby give and bequeath unto my said wife Selah all my live stock, Horses cattle sheep. hogs & poultry of every description and also my still with all my distilling utensils belonging thereto with all my Books & other moveable & personal property of every description whatever during her lifetime after which it is my desire that all go to my son Accademus
