

then upon subscribe his name at the end of said
will as an assisting witness thereto and at the
request and in the presence of the said testator
and this deponent further saith that at the said
time when the said testator subscribed his name
to the said last will as aforesaid and at the time
of the deponents subscribing his name, as an
assisting witness thereto, as aforesaid the said Sarkin
Nolan was of sound mind and memory of full age
to execute a will, and was not under any restraint to
the knowledge, information or belief of this deponent.

Sarkin Nolan, of the County of Robeson and
State of North Carolina, being of sound
mind and considering the uncertainty
of my earthly existence do make and declare
this my last Will and Testament, in manner
and form, as following that is to say
I give and deliver to my eldest son James
Nolan one dollar to gather with all of the
lands, and other property that I have herebefore
given unto him I give and deliver unto my son
William S. Nolan two dollars, to gather with all
the lands and property that I have herebefore
before given unto him, I give and deliver
to my son, Josiah, Nolan one dollar to gather
with the lands and other property that I have
herebefore given unto him,
I give and deliver to my daughter Polly Roark
one feather bed, together with all I have herebefore
to her, given unto her, I give and deliver to my
daughter Elizabeth Lewis, fifty five dollars in
hand together with all I have herebefore given
unto her, I give and deliver to my daughter
Martha C. Roark, fifty dollars, in hand to gather
with all that I have herebefore given unto her
I give and deliver to my daughter, Nancy
& Gabriel twenty five dollars, in hand,
to gather with all that I have herebefore given
unto her, I also give to my daughter Elizabeth
Lewis, and Nancy & Gabriel, Martha C. Roark
& give these three girls, all in her house, with
the contents of one feather bed, that I gave to
Polly Roark this is to be divided at the death of me
and my wife, I give and deliver to my son
John W. Nolan, all out side of the house
to gather with all I have herebefore given unto him
this includes all of my lands and personal
property.
