I Peter Testament of the County of Ashe
and State of North Carolina, being of sound
mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty
of my earthly existence do make and
declare this my last Will and Testament in
manner and form following that is to say

1st That my executors (hereinafter named)
Shall provide for my body a decent burial
suitable to the wishes of my relations and
friends and pay all funeral expenses together
with my just debts however and to whomever
owing out of the moneys that may first come
into their hands as a part or parcel of my estate
I give and devise to my beloved wife Nancy
Testerman all my property both Personal and
Real to her and to hold the same during her
natural life as so long as she remains my
Widow.

2nd In case my wife Nancy shall ever marry then
a Guardian to be appointed for my children
who may at the time of her marriage be under
the age of 21 years and my property to be
divided among my children in the following
manner that is to say to be equally divided
among the following children Sam'l Marshall
Orpha Sturgill, William Eli Raramond
Testerman Nelson Lissa Roby and William all
of it except what the Laws of North Carolina
may allow my wife Nancy Testerman in
case she should marry

3rd At her death than any of my Property which
she may be in Possession of except twenty dollars
to be divided equally among the following minor
children Sam'l Marshall Orpha Sturgill William
Eli Raramond Nelson Lissa Roby and William
the twenty dollars which I except to be
divided equally between my sons George
Testerman and Abraham Testerman it being

expressly understood that my said Sons George
Testerman and Abraham Testerman are not to
have any thing until after the death of my wife
Nancy Testerman

4th I make Salaman Stevens and Pindexter Stevens
my executors

5th By this will and Testament I revoke all others
in testimony whereof I have hereunto Subscribed my
name and affixed my seal this the 12th day of August
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and seventy eight.

I Joseph King of Laurel Township Ashe County
North Carolina being of sound mind and
memory and considering the uncertainty of this life
present and transitory life do therefore make
oracain publish and declare this to be my
last Will and Testament; That is first to
say after all my lawful debts are paid and
discharged the residue of my estate real and
personal I give bequeath and dispose as follows
to wit To my beloved wife the land
and appertinences situated therein known and
described as the old home tract lying and being
in the County of Ashe State of North Carolina
on the waters of the Big branch beginning on a
beech on a point of ridge running North thirty
paces to a white Oak thence West eighteen paces
to a cucumber thence North thirty four paces to a
locust thence west one hundred and twenty three
paces to a stake thence South sixty four paces
to a stake thence to first station containing
fifty acres more or less together with all
appertinences thereunto belonging or in any wise
pertaining I the said Joseph King do give
bequeath to my said wife Elizabeth during her
natural life time and after her death to be
divided equally among ^{themselves} as as the law
directs in said division. Likewise I make constitute and appoint
John Graybeal Esq and John Pennington Esq
to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament
In witness whereof I have here unto set down
my name and affixed my seal and did
this 28th day of April in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and forty nine
