

Last Will of R. J. Hardin
In the name of God Amen

I R. J. Hardin of the County of Ashe
and State of North Carolina being in
perfect health both in body and mind
Thanks be to God calling unto mind
the mortality of my body and knowing that
it is appointed for all men once to die.
Do make and ordain this my last will and
testament that is to say principally and first
of all I give and command my soul into the
hand of Almighty God that gave it and my
body I command to the earth to be buried in
a decent christian burial at the discretion
of my executors making & testifying that at the
general resurrection I shall receive the again
by the mighty power of God. And as touching
such earthly effects wherewithal it has pleased
God to bless me in this life I dispose of the
same in the following manner and from to the
My will is for my executors to pay all of my debts
that has been made since the rebellion of 1861
and no other debts. My will is my wife Lettie
to have her maintenance on my land during
her life time or her widowhood and no longer
and as much household furniture as will
be sufficient for her ^{use} also one cow and Calf
My will is for William P. Hardin's two girls
Eveline Wells and Martha Young to have an
equal share of one child's part of my estate
after all debts and settlements are made.
And my will is for Frank Hardin to have an
equal share and my surviving instruments
And my son Henry H Hardin to have an equal
share of the balance of my land that is not
deeded to John G. Hardin and household
furniture as the rest has had. And also Lettie
Maynard to have an equal share of my estate
except what she has received. And George Hardin
to have an equal share of my estate as the rest
has received. And my will is for John G. Hardin
to have an equal share of my real estate besides
the lands I have deeded to him whom he now

lines of ten acres and twenty acres on the back side
of the Shingle Knob on back Beaver Creek also twenty five
acres on the west side of Buck mountain on Buffalo Creek
all of which he has deeds for and his full share of all
the rest of my lands and all my farming tools that may
be on hand. My will is for Lettie to have her share of
my land that is not deeded. According to this my will
is for all my debts to be paid out of my personal property
that is all of my debts contracted since the rebellion
and all debts before 1861 is out of date & therefore
direct my executors not to pay any debts contracted before
1861 and also for none of my lands to be sold outside
of my family. To which I affix my hand Hardin and
John G. Hardin my executors to this my will
This the 20th day of July 1881.

that the said will was found among the valuable
papers and effects of the said R. J. Hardin after his death
It is further proved by the Oath and testimony of W. H.
Gandy L. H. Neal & G. M. Gray that they are acquainted
with the hand writing of the said R. J. Hardin having
often seen him write and only believe that the name
of the said R. J. Hardin subscribed to the said will
and the said will itself and every part thereof is in
the hand writing of the said R. J. Hardin. And it is
further proved by the evidence of the three last
mentioned witnesses that the said hand writing
is generally known to the acquaintance of the said
R. J. Hardin. It is therefore considered by the Court
that the said paper writing is the last will and
testament of R. J. Hardin and the same is cause
to be recorded & filed
