Now I want my children to have their parts that is now of age or become of age by the time all of my just debts are paid which I have given my wife three years to pay off in by the consent of my Executors, and if there is any personal property that has not been disposed of after my just debts have been paid & my wife receives her one third then I want it equally divided between my above named children. I want my son Henry to have my watch & one fox roan calf. I have given him of which I give my wife not my Ex any right of disposing.

Now this is my last will & testament & I have appointed my sons John A. Miller & Charles C. Miller Executors which I have power to divide my real estate into six parts to the children giving them full power to see that this my last will is carried out & put in force also to receive any titles that is due me and have power that the title of my daughter Rebecca Miller DeBorne be made to the heirs of James A.
