And it is also my desire that the
residue of my estate consisting of Personal
Property Notes, One bills, accounts and cash
and house hold and kitchen furniture be
sold and divided as follows to my beloved
Malinda Hurley and her children four
hundred and twenty Dollars to make her
equal with my beloved son Jesse Denney

then if there is still a residue remaining
after said division then it is my desire
that the same shall be divided as follows
to Joseph Denney ten Dollars.
to Syntha Barker ten Dollars.
to Elyzabeth Walton ten Dollars.
to the heirs of Eli Denney ten Dollars
to Dr. A. Denney ten Dollars the said Doctor
Money to be let on interest until she is twenty
one years of age

it is also my desire that the minerals
on the two tracts of lands be equally divided
between the said Jesse Denney and Malinda Hurley,
and it is also my desire that Elihu Phipps and
Nelson Baldwin be my executors this Sept. 7th 1901
