

Last will of Stephen Pennington

I desire that all the children shall be made equal in every thing from buying to and. I will that Cicero's land shall go at the same price that it was when he taken it in possession without paying anything for the improvements and in case of a division of the lands between the heirs that the said Cicero shall have his part off of the lower end adjoining his land. In case the iron ore is sold that the girls shall have the proceeds of said sale. Last of all I will that Cicero Pennington shall be my lawful executor to manage all the business of the estate.
