& Rachel Carter, agree to support maintain
and provide for the said Thomas Wayman
during his natural life in lieu of the
above described Land

Item 3rd

I also will to Nancy Wayman Casander
Her, all the household & kitchen furniture
and Three Cows

Item 6th

I give and bequeath to John Wayman
fifty dollars, twenty five he has received
out of the fifty

Item 4th

I give and bequeath to Samuel Wayman
fifty dollars, twenty five paid,

Item 5th

I give and bequeath to Margaret Anderson
fifty dollars, which is paid and held
receipts

Item 6th

I give and bequeath to Polly Duwall
fifty dollars, which is paid and
held her receipt

I give and bequeath to Wm Wayman (as fifty dollars, who he received
I hereby appoint Johnson Perkins my Executor
of this my last Will and Testament. And awake
all bills heretofore made by me. In witness

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The Last Will and Testament of Wm Brown dec.,
In the name of God Amen

I Wm Brown being of sound mind and
full in health. do make this my Last
Will and Testament

Item 1st

I will and bequeath unto Rona Brown
my wife all my Lands which I now own,
Except twenty five acres on the waters of
Big Creek. Regarding the lands of Andrew
Deekson & others including the South
end of a Seventy five acre tract, also
all the personal property house hold
and kitchen furniture, Except an interest
of fifty dollars in my horse, but of
this property bequeathed to my wife
all my just debts are to be paid

It is also my will that my wife Rona
Brown hold this property until her death
and that the lands shall then be sold
and the proceeds be divided among all
my heirs equally. Except the personal property
house hold and kitchen furniture is to
be given or I bequeath to be given to
my daughter Caroline Brown at the
death of her mother.

Item 2nd

I will and bequeath to my daughter
Caroline Saunders twenty five acres of
land (described in the 1st item) separate
and apart from the rest of my heirs
to make her equal with what I have
heretofore given all except Caroline

Item 3rd

I give and bequeath to my daughter
Caroline a fifty dollar interest in
my brown horse or the proceeds which
my arise from ~~that~~ said horse.

also my daughter Caroline is to have
all the personal property house hold
and kitchen furniture at her mother's
death. I also appoint my wife Rona
Brown as Executor with my friend
