Least will and testament of James Snell a
knowing that it is the common lot of all men
to die and enjoying health of body and being of
sound mind I do hereby make my last will as
follows

1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
Lucena Snell the house wherein I now live and
out buildings with privileges such as the now
enjoys during her natural life

Secondly I give and bequeath unto my son
Inclain Snell one certain tract of land containing
one hundred and thirty two + one half acres
and bounded as follows Beginning on a chestnut
leaving on a ridge in Waddles line corner of
Elizabeth Snells lot. Thence North 20 West 9 poles
to a white oak an old corner then East 25 poles
to a dogwood then North 11 West 104 poles to a Hickory
then South 49 West 4 poles to a Hickory then North
54 West 24 poles to a chestnut oak then South 45 West
14 poles to a white oak then South 53 West 52 poles
to a chestnut. Then West 13 poles to a white oak and
old corner then West 123 poles leaving the long
branch to a water oak Samuel Summers corner
then with his line South 57 East 24 poles to two
Spaniard oaks then South 20 East 28 poles to a Hickory
then South 12 West 14 poles to a chestnut. Then South
20 West 9 poles to a dogwood. Then South 58 East
15 poles to a chestnut oak then South 27 East 72
poles to a Hickory near a chestnut bush then North
70. East 62 poles to a white oak. Then North 68 East
56 poles poles to the beginning

3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth
Snell one certain tract of land bounded as
follows Beginning on a corner stone corner of
Johnston Acres and wife lot then for a division
line 54^{1/2} West 68 poles to a dogwood and Hickory
on a ridge in Waddles line. Then with same
North 7 East 36 poles to a white oak. Then North
5 West 14 poles to a black oak. Then North 20
west 12 poles to a chestnut leaving corner of
Melvin Snells lot the division line between

said Elizabeth & Melvin Snell 48 West 54 poles
to a white oak then South 70. West 82 poles to a Hickory
in Samuel Summers line near a Chestnut bush
then South 27. East 16 poles to a white oak then South 14. East
30 poles to a dead white oak. Then South 12 poles to a white oak
then South 36. East 36 poles to a high dead white oak. Then
corner of Ed. Rose & wife lot with the lines of same East
40 poles to a Hickory near the long branch then South 32 East
4 poles to the beginning containing 60^{1/2} Acres

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my son and daughter
Johnston & Martha Rose one certain tract or part of land
Beginning on a acre high white oak stand in Samuel
Summers line South 57. East 36 poles to a Hickory then South
23. East 38 poles to a chestnut stand. Then East 7 poles to a
Hickory. Then South 20. East 34 poles to Grace Ann Hardy corner
then East 32 poles to a fallen white oak in the old line then with
same North 10 poles to a Hickory near the fork of long branch
then of the east prong of the same North 42 East 48 poles to a
white oak. Then North 23 East 32 poles to a water oak near Waddles
line. Then with said Waddles line North 46. West 27. poles to a
Hickory. Then North 45 West 18 poles to a white oak. Then North
23 poles to a white oak. Then North 15. West 23 poles to a white oak
then North 5. West 20 poles to a dogwood and Hickory a corner of
Elizabeth Snells lot. Then South 54^{1/2} West 68 poles to a corner
stone a division line between said Elizabeth Snell and
said Rose & his wife. Then South 32. East 48 poles to a Hickory near
the long branch then West 40 poles to the beginning containing
70. acres

5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Grace Ann
Hardy one certain tract of land bounded as follows
Beginning on a Hickory in Jim Blum's line running
South 6. East 4 poles to a chestnut then South 45. East
12 poles to a maple. Then North 60. East 26 poles to a Hickory
near the fork of long branch. Then North 48 poles to a
fallow white oak a corner of Rose & wife lot. Then West
39. poles to the beginning being a division line between
said Hardy & Rose & wife containing 11 acres all the
aforeaid land lying and being on the waters of
long branch of Little Willow Creek in Hoke County
North Carolina. I furthermore enjoin my son Melvin
Snell to pay to Grace Ann Hardy back taxes as shall
make her lot equal to the other 70. acre lots
I give and bequeath all my personal effects

To my son Melvin Inwall in Consideration of
which he the said Melvin Inwall is to provide
for Support and Take Care of his Father & Mother
The said Thomas Inwall & Louisa Inwall during
their natural lives. In testimony whereof I have
