

Will of W. G. Moore

I W. G. Moore of Ashe County North Carolina  
being of sound and disposing mind and  
memory but mindful of the uncertainty  
of this mortal life and knowing that it is  
appointed unto all men to die do make  
publish and declare the following to be my  
last will and testament. That is to say  
Item 1<sup>st</sup> as touching my worldly substance  
with which God has blessed me I will and  
devise all my lands and tenements wherein  
I now live containing fifty three acres more  
or less together with my household and kitchen  
furniture unto my grandson Nelson B. Moore  
to have and enjoy the same after the death of  
my wife Elizabeth. His desire to my said grandson  
is upon this express condition if he continues  
with me during my life time and takes care  
of me and my wife as he has heretofore done  
then the property above devised is to be his.  
But if my wife continueth me she is to have  
her home here the same as she now has  
during her life.

As to the remainder of my estate of every kind  
and description I will and direct the same  
to be equally divided between my daughters  
Malinda Motley Charlotte J. Green and my said  
grandson Nelson & their heirs should any of  
them die during my lifetime. This last  
devise to take effect after the payment of funeral  
expenses.

I hereby constitute and appoint my said  
grandson Nelson B. Moore my Executor to  
this my last will and testament and hereby  
direct him to carry out its provisions as here  
declared. And certifying all former wills  
by me made I now declare this only to be  
my last will and testament. Done on this
