Know all men by these presents that I Wells Blains
of the County of Ohio and State of North Carolina being
aware of the uncertainty of life and the certainty of
death and in failing health bid of sound mind
and memory do make and declare this to be my
last will and testament in regard to the
disposition and distribution of all my real property
in the following described manner. First
I give devise and bequeath to Eli
Galvin two hundred and fifty dollars
which he already bears, or will receive
one hundred and fifty dollars which was
paid by myself and son hundred dollars
which has been paid him the said Eli Galvin by
Hiram M. Blains according to my directions
Second

I give devise and bequeath to Leith M. Blains my son
two tracts of land lying and being in
the County and State of Franklin being a part
of the same wherein I the said Wells Blains now
live. First tract better known as the Grandmother
mill tract and the adjoining land thereto so contain-
ing fifty six acres more or less beginning on a
White Oak Wells Blains and Green Reedy's corner running
a North West direction to a Black Gum in a few
rows thence the same direction with the fence
to the corner of the fence where it joins another fence
about two rods North East of a White Oak tree
thence to a stake in the corner of the fence
field and at the corner of two rods thence in a

Westward direction with the fence to a line in
Wells Blains' & Joe Blains line thence an Eastward
direction with said line to an Ash in the branch.
Thence a South Eastward direction with said line to
a Black Gum. Thence North $6^{\circ} 45'$ 0.5 poles to a pole
of stones near a Maple tree a North with the said
Blains and Blummers line to a stake on top of the
ridge just above Charley Hedges tree a North direction
until the said Wells Blains and Charley Hedges line
to a Hickory tree a North East direction to a
Buckeye at the Creek. Then a North $20^{\circ} 30'$ 1/2 poles
to Lynn's Branch line South 78° East
up said branch 16 poles to a Stake then a South 8°
west 20 poles to a White Oak tree with 3 poles
to a Chestnut Oak tree a South 63° west 1/2 poles
with the extreme height of the ridge to a Spanish Oak
tree a South 50 poles to a Chestnut tree a South
 10° west 20 poles to a Stake in the Woods near a white
Oak at the foot of the ridge tree at the beginning.
The second tract thence as a part of the same of
Eliza Hiles land adjoining previously containing
ten acres Beginning on a White Oak the said
Wells Blains and Green Reedy's corner running
East with Reedy's line 55 poles to a White Oak tree
South 18° west 32 poles to a Stake thence South
 86° west 40 poles to a stake in the said Blains' line
thence North 11° west with said line 36 poles to
the beginning except that the said Leith M. Blains
shall pay Elizabeth M. Hines three hundred dollars
one half cash the remaining sum half in
goods trade to be paid in four equal payments
in one year three and four years after the
death of the said Wells Blains

I give devise and bequeath to Hiram Marshall
Blains my only remaining son the remainder
of the farm on which I the said Wells Blains
now live in clearing the house and other build-
ings on the said remainder of said farm
Beginning on a White Oak Wells Blains &
Green Reedy's corner and at the beginning corner
of the first tract unless to Leith M. Blains
running with the division line of the first tract

will unto Lee M. Blivins & the Jno. Blummers
line thence as South west direction unto
the Jno. Blummers line to a corner of
the said Wells Blivins Jno. Blummers & Elizabeth
Francis lands thence East with Francis line to
a small White Oak tree Blivins & Francis corner
thence South 70° East 42' n poles to a small grove
thence with the said Wells Blivins and Elizabeth
Francis lines & various corners so as to cover the
said Wells Blivins Francis and James P. Lovestands
corner thence South 65° 44' E East 28' n poles to
Black Gum and the back border of a drain thence
North 78° 5' E East 30' n poles to a stake in the
Wells line thence with his line North 1° 5'
East 25' n poles to a stake said Wells Blivins'
corner thence North 11° 40' E East 32' n poles to a
White Oak thence North 21' n poles to a White
Oak at the Beginning except that the said James
W. Blivins shall pay to Elizabeth M. Blivins two
hundred dollars one hundred dollar note
paid in cash and one hundred dollar note
paid in good trade to be paid instead
equal installments one hundred dollars and
fifty dollars per annum after the death of the said Wells
Blivins.

I give depositions and say unto my only daughter
Elizabeth M. West give him three hundred and
one hundred dollars to be paid by W. Blivins as
her installments State and two hundred dollars
per half year by Hiram Marshall Blivins as her install-
ments.

I further depose and declare that if
either myself the said Wells Blivins or my wife
Katy Blivins should get sick in any way or
be unable to get in a public institution would unable
to take care of each other or to take care of our
debt so that if any expense should be incurred
or any additional money for the benefit and comfort
of life or the said Wells Blivins or his wife Katy
Blivins during the time of this natural life that
the said Lee M. Blivins Hiram M. Blivins and
Elizabeth M. West shall each one pay equally

our share the expenses shall may be incurred
by or on account of the infirmity of either the
said Well. Blivins or his wife Katy Blivins
hereinwhere where I the said Wells Blivins do
this my last will and testament have hereunto
set my hand and seal
