

The Last Will and Testament of Wm Brown dec,  
In the name of God Amen

I Wm Brown being of sound mind but  
fallo in health, do make this my Last  
Will and Testament

I will and bequeath unto Rona Brown  
my wife all my Lands which I now own,  
Except twenty five acres on the waters of  
Dag Creek. Rejoining the lands of Andrew  
Jackson & others including the South  
end of a Quainty fine dead tract, also  
all the personal property house hold  
and kitchen furniture, Except an interest  
of fifty dollars in my horse, but of  
this property bequeathed to my wife  
all my last debts are to be paid

It is also my will that my wife Rona  
Brown hold this property until her death  
and that the lands shall then be sold  
and the proceeds be divided among all  
my heirs equally, Except the personal property  
house hold and kitchen furniture is to  
be given or I bequeath to be given to  
my daughter Caroline Brown at the  
death of her mother,

I will and bequeath to my daughter  
Caroline Saunders twenty five acres of  
land (described in the 1<sup>st</sup> item) separate  
and apart from the rest of my heirs  
to make her equal with what I have  
heretofore given all except Caroline

I give and bequeath to my daughter  
Caroline a fifty dollar interest in  
my brown horse or the proceeds which  
my arise from ~~that~~ said horse.

also my daughter Caroline is to have  
all the personal property house hold  
and kitchen furniture at her mothers  
death. I also appoint my wife Rona
