to be traded by one of the executors viz J. F. Dillard  
& the proceeds to go to the use of the family as I  
have given Julia Phillips forty dollars & now give  
her fifteen dollars more making in all fifty  
five Dollars. The property willed to my wife  
Ellen Phillips I now give J. F. Dillard power  
to assist her in repairing, changing or disposing  
of & to see that the same goes to the use of the  
family.
