 of my estate real and personal, I give, bequeath, and dispose of
 as follows: To my beloved wife the land, appertaining
 situated thereon known and described as the Brown farm, lying
 in the County and State aforesaid as aforesaid by me as long as
 she remains my widow and after her death to be equally divided
 among my heirs. In witness I have hereunto subscribed my
 name and affixed my seal this the 27th day of June 1873.
 The above written instrument was subscribed ^{to} William Brown
 by the said William Brown in my presence, and acknowledged
 by him to each of us, and he at the same time published & declared
 the above instrument to be his last will and testament
 and we at the testator's request and in his presence have signed
 our names as witnesses thereto and written opposite our names
