

Last Will and Testament of William Wyatt
In the Name of God Amen
I William Wyatt being of sound mind and memory
Considering however the uncertainty of this Life doth
make and publish this my last Will and Testament
hereby revoking all former wills by me made -
that is to say I bequeath my soul to God who gave
me body to the dust whence it rose wishing to be
buried in a decent Christian like manner according
to the wishes of friends Item 2nd Concerning my worldly
property I wish to dispose of it as follows I give
and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susanna Wyatt
and during her natural life all the lands of my home
plantation wherein I now reside and all the lands
that I now own adjoining the same tract with
the improvements thereon there are two tracts of land on
the head of Phenix Creek containing fifty acres each
other with all their wagons Stock of every kind &
all precious that may be at hands at the time of
my death to be managed as she may think proper
during her life and at her death all the said lands
with the improvements & appurtenances and all the personal
property I give and bequeath unto my son Alexander
Wyatt and his heirs in fee simple forever In this item
is included all debts that may be due me and although
that may be at hands at my death Item 3rd I give &
bequeath unto my daughter Maria Graybeal wife of
Eli Graybeal during her life a tract of land wherein
she now resides commonly called the Old George
Brown lands containing 240 acres more or less it
including two tracts that I purchased from George
Brown son and it being on the waters of Buffalo to be
her right and property during her life to be managed
as she chooses without of her husband and after his
death the said lands to belong to her children &
declared in
present of us
