

April 1st 1878 William Ashley Will

Know all Men by these Presents that I William Ashley in this my last will and testament do bequeath my Real Estate as follows
 Item 1st First that after all my Just debts are paid I give my land upon which I now live I to my wife Francis Ashley to keep and to hold as long as she shall live with all the appurtenances thereon
 Item 2nd Second that after her death the land shall be Valued by three disinterested Persons and then divide said valuation in to five Shears
 Item 3rd third I bequeath one of those Shears to my son bread Ashley
 Item 4th another to my daughter Elizabeth Ashley
 Item 5th another to my daughter Mary Ashley
 Item 6th another to my daughter Nancy Ashley
 Item 7th and the other to my daughter Mandy Ashley
 Item 8th But that my son bread Ashley shall have and hold the Land provided he will pay to each of the above named heirs their fifth of the valuation fourth I give to the rest of my heirs one dollar each to be paid by the above named heirs this the second day of Sept 1876.
