I, John Jackson being sick of body but of perfect health of memory praise be almighty God for it hath appointed this to be my last will & testament in manner & form as follows.

First I bequeath my soul into the hands of almighty God who gave it me, hoping through the merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to obtain mercy of pardon for all my past sins & as far my worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me my debts being first paid I give in manner and form as follows. I give to my beloved son John Jackson the plantation with all the land belonging thereto after the decease of my wife Ann Jackson she & two enjoy the same if she doth not (in bar) it during her natural life & after her decease to the aforesaid John Jackson & his heirs forever.

Impro. I also give unto my son John Jackson two cows & calves they being already of his own proper mark, also I give him my new hat & fettle gun I also give him my chish with the tools belonging thereto.

Impro. As far all the rest of my worldly estate my horse I give unto my well beloved wife & the rest of my children "I had

by her and not with her to be equally divided between them as they "agree. My horse, Bridell & saddle is excepted for that I also give unto son John Jackson.

Impro. As for my land as I have given to my John Jackson it is mortgaged to Mr Alderson for twenty five pound & if it "so happen as my wife & son cannot "the money to "Mortgaged it is my desire that my Executors should see that part "as lies between "

line of the Rich Neck Swamp to clear "of the land & so by them whereby, having disposed of all my worldly "my body I also dispose to the earth to be decently buried at the "ton of my Executors and for the performance of this my last will "testament I do appoint Mr. William Marton & my well beloved "to be my sole Executors to do & regulate & fulfil this my last "the best of their knowledge.
