Chick and hunting Gun with State of Broad cloath cloaths
The above Negro fellow and House hold furniture

I Lend my Beloved Wife During her Natural Life afterwards to be
sold for the use of my Children and Equally Divided amongst
them & that my Beloved wife should be my Sole Executrix Given un
der my hand and Seal this thirteenth Day of September one thousand
seven hundred & Seventy three

or widowhood and after that which shall hapen first then
my lawful Executor made
