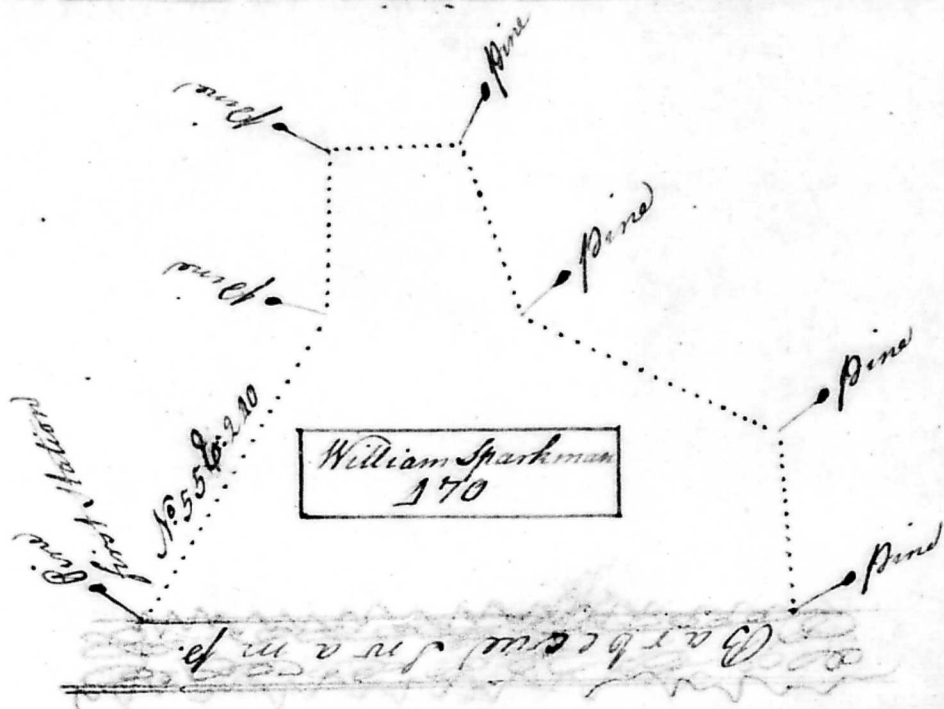

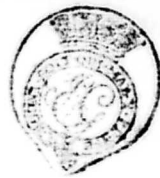
Platted by a Scale of One
