And the defendant further saith, that at the said time when the said testator subscribed his name to the said last Will as aforesaid and at the time of this defendant's subscribing his name as an attesting witness thereto, as aforesaid, the said Alexander Galloway was of sound mind and memory, of full age to execute a Will, and was not under any restraint, to the knowledge, information, or belief of this defendant. I, Alexander Galloway of the County of Brunswick, and State of North Carolina, hereby revoking all former wills by me made, do make this my last will and testament, in manner following. That is to say: I direct that my just debts be paid with all convenient speed.

All of my estate, real, personal, and mixed, I give, devise and bequeath unto my Children, viz.:

Rosella, Anna Evangeline, Thomas Neil,  
Mary Elizabeth, John Wesley, and my Grand Daughter, Mattie

Hiles, and their heirs forever, to be divided equally among them. It is my will and desire and direct

that my Wife Rebecca Jane Galloway, hold in trust, for said Children, and Grand Child, all my estate, real, personal, and mixed, until they shall attain twenty one years of age, and that she use such portion of the interest, and produce, as shall be just and proper for the education and support of my Children, and Grand Child, Mattie Hiles and support of herself provided, that said Rebecca Jane Galloway, shall continue to be my widow; but if she should marry, then, and in that case, it is my will and I direct that she no longer have any interest in or control over my estate. It is my will, and I direct, that when

my eldest Child attain twenty one years of age, she be given her portion of my estate, and that as soon as each of my other Children and Grand Child, Mattie Hiles, shall attain his or her majority, he or she be given his or her portion of my estate, and that

in case of the death of either of said Children, or any grand Child, Mattie Hiles, my estate be equally divided among the survivors. I appoint James Brew, and my wife during her widowhood, Guardian to each of my children during their minority; and I direct that neither be required to give bonds for their fidelity as such guardians.

I constitute and appoint J. P. Bell the executors of this my last will and I direct that he be not required to give bond. In witness whereof I the said Alexander Galloway have caused to my hand and seal, this the 17th day of June Eighteen Hundred and Ninety Five.
