 body, tho' of a sound mind & perfect understanding I do make
 this my last Will and Testament, and desire it may be executed
 all as such. First, I leave all my Estate, real and personal, in
 lands, tenements, stock &c., at the disposal of my Executors for
 them to dispose of as they think best for the schooling of my children
 and support of my family, and paying my debts. I will and
 request after my debts are paid for my wife Amelia to have one
 share of all my property with my children share and share alike.
 I further request that all my estate remain together, and as each
 child comes of age, or marries then for them to have their part and
 off to them as they come of age or marry. Furthermore I will that
 my wife Amelia shall have the use of a certain piece of land
 her lifetime of she chooses - viz.: - Beginning at the mouth
 of the Middle Dore Creek, running up the creek or Swamp near the
 old school house - from thence about a South course to the large timber
 from thence to the mouth of Little Swamp, from thence to the mouth
 of big Swamp - from thence up and along the sun to the first
 station including the buildings, orchard, &c. - and do constitute and
 appoint my wife Amelia and Joseph Hewitt Executors to this
 my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal the 28th of October, 1811.

 and I do hereby empower her further to sell or remove any or all
 of my property to any State or County in the United States of America,
 without any let, hindrance or molestation for the time of her natural
 life, or widowhood; and if my wife chooses to marry her part may be
 as prescribed by law in such cases provided, and the remainder to be
 equally divided amongst my children including my grand daughter
 Elizabeth Keith. Signed, sealed, and delivered this seventh of
 September in the year of our Lord Christ, One thousand eight
 hundred and six, and in the thirty first year of the independence
 of America. Signed, sealed and delivered in the presence
