I, Samuel Adams being now of sound mind and memory but being sick and confined to the Community Hospital in the City of Wilmington, N.C. and desiring to provide for the distribution of my estate in case of my death do make and declare this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows.

First- I desire that my body be given a Christian burial in accordance with the wishes of wife and in keeping with my station in life.

Second- I desire that my Executor hereafter named to pay of and discharge all my just debts.

Third- I give, devise and bequeath all my real and personal property that I may own at the time of my death to Reuben McNeil to have and to hold the same in trust for my beloved wife Clara Adams for and during the term of her natural life and after her death to be his the said Reuben McNeil in fee simple forever saving and excepting from all the real estate above mentioned six acres of land to be carved from my ten acre tract of land located near the Cross Roads leading to Moores Chapel in the County of Brunswick, which I direct my Executor, Reuben McNeil hereafter named to convey as follows: Two acres each of the said Moores Chapel tracts to Eva May Davis, two acres to Laura Moore and two acres to Lizzie Moore exercising his my said Executor's discretion as to the allotment should there be any dissension as to the allotment of the six acres above referred to.

I, further direct my Executor hereinafter named to consult my friends John D. Bellamy and Sons as to the probating of my said will and the administration of my affairs.

Fourth- I hereby constitute and appoint Reuben McNeil, Executor of this my last will and testament.
