I, B.P. Finch, of the aforesaid county and state, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament:

FIRST: My Executor hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and pay all funeral expenses, together with all my just debts, out of the first moneys which may come into his hands belonging to my estate.

SECOND: I give and devise to my daughter, Lizzie Massey, three (3) acres of land nine and eight-tenths acre tract or parcel of land, including all the buildings thereon, and lying on the road leading from Zebulon to Wakefield, in Wake County, North Carolina, and known as the Charley Whitley property. On the remaining six acres and eight-tenths my wife, Elizabeth A. Finch, is to have a life time right, and at the death of my wife Elizabeth A. Finch, I give and devise the said remaining six acres and eight-tenths acre to my daughter Lizzie Massey, provided she is living at the death of my wife; and if said Lizzie Massey is not living at the death of my wife, the said six acres and eight-tenths, is to be sold and the funds from said sale is to be equally distributed among my children who may be living at the death of my wife.

THIRD: I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Elizabeth A. Finch a life time right with full control, over the one hundred and sixty five acre tract or farm lying about one mile east of Wakefield, in Wake County, North Carolina, and known as the Willie Kings property. At the death of said wife, said farm is to be sold and the funds from said sale to be equally distributed among my children who may be living at the death of my wife.

FOURTH: My wife, Elizabeth A. Finch, is hereby authorized or empowered to dispose of as she sees fit, the paid up life insurance policy, which policy is made payable to my estate, and with the Union Central Insurance Company on the life of said wife, in the sum of one thousand (1000.) dollars.

FIFTH: I hereby constitute and appoint my son James Edgar Finch my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof.
