I, Benjamin Fullwood of Supply, County of Brunswick, State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, to wit:-

- First All my just debts and funeral expenses shall be first fully paid.
- Second I give, devise and bequeath the tract of land known as the Arnold tract, to my son Henry Fullwood and my grand son Moses Fullwood, to be equally divided by a line running North and South through said tract.

land, the western half to be Henry Fullwood, the eastern half to be my Grand son's Moses Fullwood.

Third I give devise and bequeath the Stand Berry tract of land, to my two sons Henry and Butler Fullwood, to equally share and share alike, and my son Jack Fullwood to have the privilege to fish on said tract of land as long as they can agree, but a disagreement will debar Jack Fullwood from said privilege.

Fourth I give, devise, devise and bequeath the Sapling bay tract of land to my six daughters Merena, Margan, Holl and Bellamy, Sarah Gore, Phoeby Fullwood, Mary H. Fullwood and Hume's Fullwood to be equally divided among them, and if either of them should want to sell their part they are to give one of the other heirs the first refusal.

Fifth I give devise and bequeath the Homestead tract of land to my son James B. Fullwood, and that my wife Phoeby is to have a life time right in said land and home as long as she lives.

Sixth, I give, devise and bequeath to my son Benjamin Fullwood Jr. the tract of land in Smithville Township known as the Wescott land, provided he pay \$200.00 to the other heirs, and if he does not want the land for himself he is to give it to his children to sell said land will make the 6th section of this will null and void.

Seventh I give devise and bequeath all of my cattle, sheep and hogs to be equally divided among my children.
