I, J. S. Clemmons, of the aforesaid county and State, being of sound mind do give and devise to my son J. L. Clemmons, and his heirs, in fee simple, a tract of land in Lockwoods Folly Township, Brunswick County, adjoining the lands of my-self Willie Clemmons, W. L. Catton and James Bellamy, described and bounded as follows, viz:

"Beginning at Jacob Lewis' corner and running with his line South 24 West, 72 poles to a stake in said line; thence North 70 West, 30 poles to a dead pine; thence North 48 East, 84 poles to a dead pine; thence North 58 poles to a stake in the old line; thence with said old line North 65 West, 125 poles to a spruce pine in a bay corner corner of the original tract; thence South 35 East, with meanders of the branch 74 poles to a stake in the run of -----said branch; thence with said branch South 44 West, 26 poles to a stake in Jacob Lewis' line in said branch; thence with said line to the beginning. Containing sixty-one acres more or less and being the new house tract of land and the one on which I now live, and the last described tract of land in that certain deed to me from William H.
