xxx I, R. J. Hyatt, of the aforesaid County and State, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last Will and Testament:

1. My executor, hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my friends and relative, and pay all funeral expenses, together with my just debts, out of the first moneys which may come into his hands belonging to my estate. It is my wish and desire that all my personal property be sold by my executor at either private or public sale, which ever may seem most advantageous to him, for the purpose of making cash assets.

2. My will and desire is that if there should be any surplus over and above the payment of debts and expenses, that such surplus shall be paid over to my housekeeper, Susie C. Floyd.

3. It is distinctly understood by me that all household furniture and fixtures contained in the dwelling house now occupied by me is the property of the said Susie C. Floyd and I own no part or interest therein. All livestock, including pigs and poultry are also the property of the said Susie C. Floyd and I own no interest therein.

4. I hereby constitute and appoint my trusted friend, G. Butler Thompson, my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, without bond, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments be me heretofore made.
