Pepper and wife, 27th February, 1882, said conveyance being duly recorded in Book AA, page 229, Records of Brunswick County, to which reference is hereby expressly made, save and except so much thereof as heretofore conveyed to Benjamin F. Newton, as will more fully appear by reference to the records of Brunswick County.

THIRD: I give and bequeath unto my said Brother, Benjamin F. Newton, an Trust for Billy Newton, Laura Harker Taylor, Carrie Harker, Elsie Harker, Holmes Harker, Annie Harker, James Fraiser, Otto Fraiser and Nannie Fraiser, all of my personal property, wheresoever found.

FOURTH: I hereby appoint my said Brother, Benjamin F. Newton, to be Executor of my will and testament, without bond, with full power to sell real estate hereinbefore described, either publicly or privately, as may seem best to him, and to make title to the same. Also to sell all personal property, either publicly or privately, and make title to same, and to divide the funds received there from after paying just debts and funeral expenses as provided in paragraph First between the devisees named in paragraph Second and Third, share and share alike.

It is my will and desire that my Executor shall have James Fraiser, Otto Fraiser and Nannie Fraiser placed in the Methodist Orphanage, or some other Orphanage or Institution where they can and will be trained and reared in the faith of the Christian Religion.
