IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN! I, Stephen Williams,
the County of Brunswick County and State of North Carolina
do make & order this my last will and testament. First, I give and
bequeath to my wife Polly Williams one negro man slave named
Simon, and one negro girl slave named Rachel with her future
increase, during her life; after the decease of my wife the said negro
I give to my sons John & James Williams to be equally divided
between them, share & share alike agreeable to their value; and
I further more give to my wife the choice of two feather beds and
sufficient bed clothing for the same, one more named Fly, or one
of iron, the choice of three cows & calves, three sows & pigs, an
or cart, spinning Wheel & Loom, together with such part of my
household & kitchen furniture as she may choose, with sufficient
sufficient provision for herself, negroes & stock as may be necessary
for one year, with Dover in my lands including my
house & buildings attached to the same. - Second, I give & bequeath
to my son Zadock Williams, this first, one negro woman slave named
Patty & her child, together with her future increase; Third, - I give &
bequeath to my son John Williams, this first, one negro man slave
named Peter, and also my house clock; Fourth, - I give & bequeath
to my son James Williams, & his heirs, one negro boy slave named
Charles. - Fifth, - I give and bequeath to my daughter Lucy Williams
one negro girl slave named Charlotte, to her & her posterity, and
if my daughter should die without issue, then & in that case, it is my
will & desire that the said slave shall go to my grandchild James Washington
Williams. - Sixth, - I desire my negro woman slave named
Betty shall be sold to best advantage & the money arising from
it to be equally divided between my grandchildren Stephen & John
Minty share & share alike. I desire the remainder of my old
household & kitchen furniture together with the crop that shall
bequeath to my wife, shall be sold by my Executor herein
named and the proceeds from the same to be subsequently divided
between my wife and children share & share alike, after one hundred
dollars shall be deducted from the same, which said one hundred
dollars I hereby bequeath to my daughter Nancy Williams.
Eighth, I give and bequeath to my son James Williams, the
my plantation on which I reside, after the death of his mother.
I desire that my lands on the head of Jumping Branch
be sold and the proceeds equally divided between my children
share & share alike. Lastly, I nominate & appoint my wife
Polly Williams and my son James Williams, Executrix & Co-
Administrator of my last will & testament, as witness my hand and
seal this day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand
Eight hundred and forty three. Stephen Williams.

Brunswick County, } Inhabitant of this County & State aforesaid,
being of sound mind & memory, but advanced in
years & of feeble health & believing my mortal existence
near at hand, do make this my last Will & Testament in
writing & for ever following, to wit; - In the first place I do
not sell any property of whatever kind coming together on the
plantation where I now live until my son Abraham Webb
shall become of age for the joint benefit of my wife Sarah
and her children till that time that is the children now
born viz., Oliver, Lydia, Mary and Elizabeth, he shall
my wife Sarah marry again then tenth anniversary
she is enabled without loss any part of my property
the plantation being of age. I do make & publish

that when my son Amstrong becomes of age that all my
parishable property be divided equally between my said wife
Sarah & her four children as above named to share & share alike
In the third place I give to my wife Sarah the plantation
on which I live for and during her natural life (that is if she
does not marry) and after her death solely to my son Amstrong
the residue of my real estate to be divided equally between the
other children that is, Oliver, Lydia & Mary, but not however
till the death of Sarah, my wife. In the fourth place I appoint
my friend Jessie Freeman as Guardian to my children as above
named & also sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament.
