Pullan one Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each, to Mrs. Ida E. Morse two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars to Helen Pinner one Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars to Mrs. Sallie Greenbaum Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars to Miss Lucretia Morrison one Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars and to Mrs. Lila Adams one Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.
